

Section 1: Conflict Summary Paragraph (RI.2, L.2)

- Minimum of 2 examples (quotes) from the novel
- Must explain *how* these quotes highlight the main tension/issue in the story.
- Must be written using academic, formal voice (no “I think...”)
- Should clearly indicate that you’ve been reading your novel and understand the main conflict

Section 2: Sentence Imitation (L.2, L.6)

- Choose **2 sentences** in your novel that are interesting
- Rewrite each sentence using the same basic structure and parts of speech (subject, verb, object)
- Write the basic structural formula below each imitation (ex: Subject + adverb + verb +object)

Section 3: Vocabulary (L.2, L.4, L.6)

- Find **3 new vocabulary words** as you’re reading your novel. For each word:
- Quote the sentence the word came from in the book
- Write the definition of the word and label the part of speech
- Use the word in 2 different sentences

Section 4: Recommendation (L.2, L.6)

You’ll need to give me a solid impression of what the book was like for you. To do this you’ll need to write a 6-8 sentence paragraph(s) answering some of the following questions:

- What captivated your attention?
- Why should your peers read it?
- What was unique about this book?
- What was the best part about the book?

How to turn the BP in:

You will need to turn this in **two different ways** to me. A printed **physical copy to the box** and **digitally to Turnitin.com**. It is *very* important to turn this in *both ways*. Our library has printers for use if you do not have a printer at home.

Turnitin.com Information:

1. Go to www.turnitin.com

<p>Conventions</p> <p>15%</p>	<p>Punctuation, spelling, and grammar are correct, and a wide range of punctuation is used. The piece has very few errors, if any, and they do not distract readers. Clearly, the student has revised and edited his/her writing.</p>	<p>Punctuation, spelling, and grammar are primarily correct. The minor errors do not distract readers, and it is clear that the student has revised and edited his/her writing.</p>	<p>The piece has mostly correct punctuation, spelling, and grammar. The errors distract readers, and the revision and editing needs to be more thorough.</p>	<p>The piece has numerous punctuation, spelling, and grammatical errors. They distract readers and/or prevent readers from understanding the message. Significant revision and editing needs to occur.</p>
<p>Formatting</p> <p>5%</p>	<p>The paper is submitted using turnitin.com, is double spaced, and uses 12 pt font. Each section is clearly labeled and the title is the title of the book.</p>	<p>One required formatting element is missing, but the majority of the formatting is done correctly.</p>	<p>Two required formatting elements are missing.</p>	<p>The majority of the paper is not formatting properly.</p>
